



RN to PARAMEDIC TRANSITION COURSE



This Course is an abbreviated Paramedic Training Program designed specifically for licensed Registered Nurses who are also currently licensed as an Emergency Medical Technician in Michigan. The course has a focus on EMS Operations, Medical Legal Issues, the Pre-Hospital Care of the Sick and Injured Patient and Hazardous Situations. The course requires approximately 108 hours of didactic training (Classroom), a minimum of 24 hours on an ALS Ambulance, minimum of 16 hours in the Emergency Department if no ED experience and 50 ALS Team Leader Contacts. *Note: If the RN has ED experience, 16 additional hours on the ALS Ambulance can be substituted for the ED time.*

Courses are designed to prepare the student for licensure in the State of Michigan.

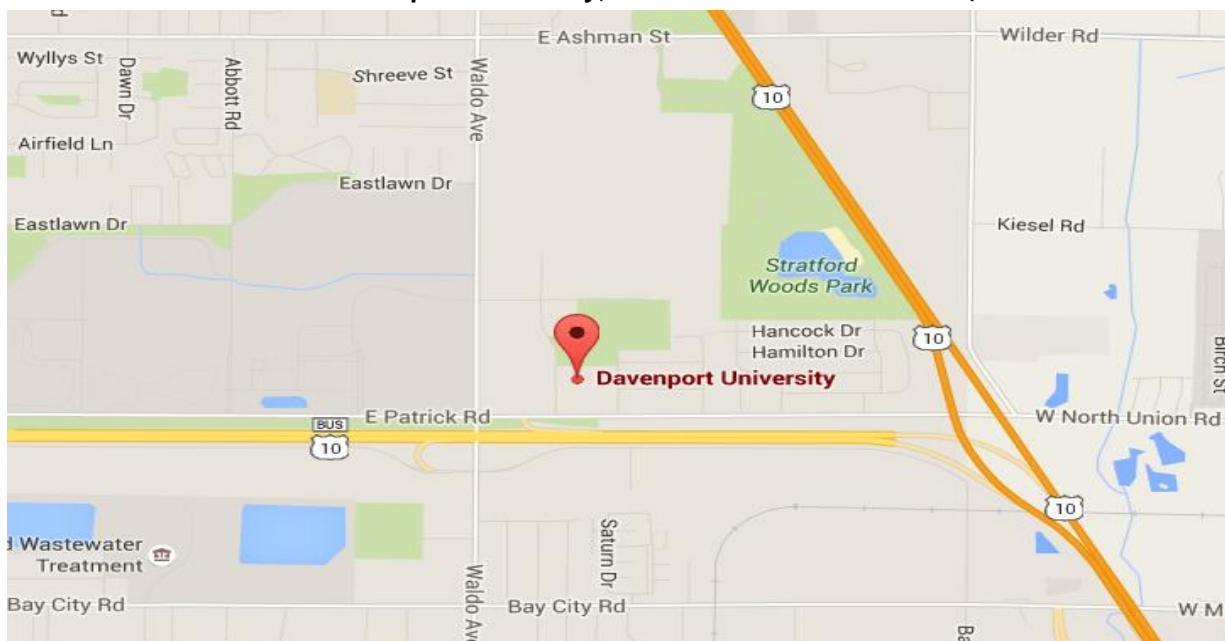
Pre-Requisites and Orientation:
